



WALKING

Walk 3 - Old Oaks, Deer Walk, Gypsy Lane, Lower Tor, Stone Down

A lovely 1.8 mile walk. Take a camera as deer can often be spotted in the fields.

- Using the footpath between The Walnut Terraces and The Birches, walk to the top.
- Through the kissing gate and turn left. In 250m go through another kissing gate.
- Cross the lane and over the stile. Follow the path.
- You will pass through 6 or 7 fields, using stiles. Just keep going in a straight(ish) line, passing mostly along the bottom edge of the fields. Can be pretty muddy or boggy in places during the winter months. Deer can often be spotted in any of these fields, so keep a sharp look out and a camera at the ready!
- In approx. 1/2 mile you will emerge on Gypsy Lane. Turn right.
- Continue up this fairly steep tarmac road, passing the depot of Glastonbury Spring Water on your right.
- Follow the lane around to the left and look out for a stile on your right featuring a National Trust sign. Cross and turn right onto the base of Glastonbury Tor. The next 2 fields are pretty uneven so take care.
- Go in a diagonal direction to your right, looking for the gap between the taller trees.
- Cross the stile into the next field. Head to the top of the field.
- Follow the boundary for approx. 150m, then cross diagonally to the bottom right hand corner of the field.
- Cross the stile into Stone Down Lane and turn right.
- In approx. 250m look for the kissing gate next to the big metal gates on your left.
- In approx. 200m, turn right through kissing gate and down the lane. Home.

Other info - Dog friendly but may encounter cattle & sheep. Not suitable for wheelchairs.

Very muddy in places during winter and wet weather. Steep climb up Gypsy Lane.
